## Bray Lake Water Quality Statement

Bray Lake is a natural open air lake. It is fed by rain and ground water and run off. During periods of heavy rain it is also fed by two streams.

We have no control or influence on quality of water coming into the lake or over the quality of the water in the lake.

There is an abundance of water life in and around the lake all of which contributes to the quality of the water in the lake.

At some points during the year water quality may suffer from influences out of our control for either naturally occurring or weather related reasons. Bray Lake Watersports staff carry out daily visual checks of the water and will do their best to keep the users of Bray Lake aware of anything that may cause concern to users.

It is up to the discretion of every user whether they wish to use Bray Lake and should make their own decision on whether to enter the water. Anyone using the lake do so at their own risk.

Bray Lake Watersports treat the water twice a year with Diofix, a harmless food die that reduces sun light penetrating the water and this minimizes weed and algae growth.

Bray Lake Watersports also uses a pest control officer to help control rodents in the immediate area around the club house however anyone using the lake should take all reasonable precautions associated with Weil's Disease. If in doubt please ask the staff.

During periods of Algae bloom (none seen since the use of Diofix) all water users are required to keep clear of areas of high concentration of Algae (usually on the downwind shore). When there is concern warning notices will be placed around the Centre and users should minimize their contact with the water and avoid drinking the water.

As a general rule avoiding drinking too much water and anyone who has been in the water should shower after their activity.
